Roslyn and Hubert Dietrich Memorial Scholarship

The Roslyn and Hubert Dietrich Memorial Scholarship is an entrance scholarship valued at \$10,000, that will be provided to one selected recipient who has completed or is completing high school and is beginning full-time first year studies. The student must be co-registered with St. Jerome's University. The student must demonstrate an understanding of, and commitment to, the principles of Catholic Social Thought (CST), and identify how the funds will help them achieve their long-term goals and aspirations.

Value: One entrance scholarship valued at \$10,000 for full first year tuition.

Eligibility & Selection

- Student demonstrates an understanding of, and commitment to, the principles of Catholic Social Thought (CST): respect for the dignity of all persons, a commitment to social justice, and thoughtful contribution to the common good of society.
- Student identifies their long-term goals and aspirations, challenges they may have faced, and communicates how the funds will support their plans for the future.
- The student presents a record of extra-curricular activity, community contributions, and/or leadership experiences that show how they have positively contributed to the community (locally and/or globally).
- Student provides a letter of reference from a school counselor.
